POLICE DEPARTMENT ACTIVITY REPORT

PATROL ACTIVITY

OFFICERS ANSWERED 506 CALLS FOR SERVICE DURING JULY INCLUDING 9 DOMESTIC PROBLEMS, BURGLARIES, 8 FOR CRIMINAL DAMAGE TO VEHICLES, A DOG BITE, AND 4 TRAFFIC CRASHES INCLUDING A HIT AND RUN. 74 REPORTS WERE GENERATED. TWO MISSING JUVENILES WERE REPORTED, LOCATED AND RETURNED HOME.

A VARIETY OF ARRESTS WERE MADE INCLUDING 5 FOR POSSESSION OF CANNABIS OR DRUG PARAPHERNALIA, 3 FOR DUI, DISORDERLY CONDUCT, 13 UNLICENSED DRIVERS, AND 2 FOR CRIMINAL DAMAGE TO PROPERTY. OFFICERS SERVED 4 WARRANTS THIS MONTH, STOPPED 23 SUSPICIOUS SUBJECTS OR VEHICLES AND MADE 244 TRAFFIC STOPS.

TRUCK ENFORCEMENT GENERATED POTENTIAL FINES OF \$6,799.00

SGT. WASEK MADE A TRAFFIC STOP AFTER RUNNING A REGISTRATION CHECK ON A GMC VAN. THE PLATES CAME BACK TO A FORD SUV. UPON RUNNING A CHECK ON THE DRIVER IT WAS LEARNED HIS LICENSE WAS SUSPENDED. HE WAS TAKEN INTO CUSTODY. DURING A SEARCH OF HIS PERSON, A BAG OF PLANT MATERIAL WAS RECOVERED THAT TESTED POSITIVE FOR CANNABIS. HE WAS CHARGED WITH IMPROPER USE OF REGISTRATION, DRIVING WITH A

SUSPENDED LICENSE, NO INSURANCE AND POSSESSION OF CANNABIS.

SGT. WASEK WAS CONDUCTING A PREMISE CHECK AT A LOCAL MOTEL AND OBSERVED A VEHICLE WITH A BROKEN WINDOW. HE RAN A CHECK ON THE VEHICLE TO LOCATE THE OWNER AND CHECK ON THE DAMAGE. IT WAS LEARNED THE REGISTERED OWNER HAD A \$50,000 WARRANT FOR HIS ARREST OUT OF THE COOK COUNTY SHERIFF'S OFFICE. SGT. WASEK CHECKED AND FOUND THE SUBJECT WAS A REGISTERED GUEST AT THE MOTEL. THE SUBJECT ANSWERED THE DOOR AND ALLOWED OFFICERS TO ENTER. UPON ENTERING, OFFICERS OBSERVED BAGGIES CONTAINING PLANT MATERIAL THAT TESTED POSITIVE FOR CANNABIS. THE SUBJECT WAS TAKEN INTO CUSTODY. HE WAS PROCESSED ON THE WARRANT, CHARGED WITH POSSESSION OF CANNABIS AND TRANSPORTED TO THE MARKHAM COURTHOUSE FOR A BOND HEARING.

OFC. SZOLTYSIK AND SGT. WASEK WERE DISPATCHED TO A LOCAL MOTEL FOR A DISTURBANCE. UPON CHECKING THE AREA NO PROBLEMS WERE FOUND. WHILE CONDUCTING A CHECK OF THE MOTEL THEY DETECTED AN ODOR OF BURNT CANNABIS COMING FROM A ROOM. OFFICERS KNOCKED ON THE DOOR AND A SUBJECT

OPENED THE DOOR AND RELATED HE HAD RENTED THE ROOM. HE GAVE PERMISSION FOR OFFICERS TO CHECK THE ROOM AND LOCATED ON TOP OF THE TELEVISION WAS A CIGAR REFERRED TO AS A BLUNT. A BLUNT IS A CIGAR EMPTIED OF TOBACCO AND REFILLED WITH CANNABIS. THE PLANT MATERIAL TESTED POSITIVE FOR THE PRESENCE OF CANNABIS. THE SUBJECT WAS CHARGED WITH POSSESSION OF CANNABIS.

SGT. WASEK OBSERVED A VEHICLE TRAVELING AT A HIGH RATE OF SPEED CONFIRMED BY RADAR AT 46 MPH IN A POSTED 30 MPH SPEED ZONE. THE VEHICLE WAS ALSO TRAVELING BY STRADLING THE LANE STRIPING. AFTER THE EMERGENCY LIGHTS WERE ACTIVATED TO ATTEMPT TO STOP THE VEHICLE, IT ALMOST STRUCK A VIADUCT. AFTER STOPPING THE VEHICLE, SGT. WASEK DETECTED A STRONG ODOR OF AN ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGE EMITTING FROM THE DRIVER AS HE SPOKE. SGT. WASEK HAD THE SUBJECT PERFORM VARIOUS FIELD SOBRIETY TESTS. HE ALMOST FELL DURING ONE TEST AND FAILED ALL THE TESTS ATTEMPTED. HE WAS TAKEN INTO CUSTODY AND BROUGHT TO THE STATION. HE WAS ASKED TO TAKE A BREATH TEST AND AGREED, SUBMITTING A BREATH SAMPLE WHICH INDICATED A BLOOD ALCOHOL CONTENT (B.A.C.) OF .251. THE DRIVER WAS CHARGED WITH SPEEDING, DRIVING UNDER THE INFLUENCE OF ALCOHOL, B.A.C. OVER .08 AND NO INSURANCE.

OFC. TULEY STOPPED A VEHICLE FOR MULTIPLE LANE CHANGES WITHOUT SIGNALING. UPON RUNNING A CHECK ON THE DRIVER IT WAS LEARNED HE HAD A SUSPENDED LICENSE. HE WAS PLACED UNDER ARREST AND A SEARCH WAS CONDUCTED. 4 HAND ROLLED CIGARETTES WERE RECOVERED. THE CIGARETTES CON-

TAINED PLANT MATERIAL THAT TESTED POSITIVE FOR CANNABIS. THE DRIVER WAS CHARGED WITH FAILURE TO SIGNAL, DRIVING WITH A SUSPENDED LICENSE AND POSSESSION OF CANNABIS.

SGT. MRJENOVICH WAS DISPATCHED TO A CALL FOR CRIMINAL DAMAGE TO A VEHICLE. UPON ARRIVAL, HE OBSERVED THAT THE VICTIM'S VEHICLE HAD TWO SLASHED TIRES AND DAMAGE TO THE DRIVER'S DOOR AND WINDOW. SPEAKING WITH WITNESSES, A DESCRIPTION OF THE VEHICLE MULTIPLE OFFENDERS FLED IN WAS LEARNED. THE VICTIM KNEW THE NAMES OF TWO OFFENDERS. A SEARCH OF SECRETARY OF STATE RECORDS LOCATED ONE SUSPECT'S ADDRESS IN SOUTH HOLLAND. OFFICERS WENT TO THE ADDRESS TO FIND THE SUBJECT HAD MOVED OUT. DURING A CHECK OF THE AREA THE VEHICLE USED IN THE INCIDENT WAS LOCATED. WHILE CHECKING THE VEHICLE, ONE OF THE OFFENDERS CAME OUT OF A RESIDENCE AND WAS TAKEN INTO CUSTODY. A SECOND WAS LOCATED IN THE RESIDENCE AND WAS ALSO ARRESTED. BOTH SUBJECTS ADMITTED TO CUTTING THE TIRES WITH A KNIFE AND DAMAGING THE DOOR. THEY WERE EACH CHARGED WITH CRIMINAL DAMAGE TO PROPERTY FOR THE DAMAGE TO THE VEHICLE.

SGT. MRJENOVICH OBSERVED TWO VEHICLES TRAVELING AT A HIGH RATE OF SPEED WITH THE SECOND VEHICLE TRAVELING APPROXIMATELY HALF A CAR LENGTH BEHIND THE FIRST. THE LEAD VEHICLE TURNED AWAY AND WHILE ATTEMPTING TO CATCH THE TAILGATING VEHICLE, THE VEHICLE TRAVELED MULTIPLE TIMES OVER THE LANE STRIPING AND ACCELERATED TO A MINIMUM SPEED OF 61 MPH IN A POSTED 35 MPH ZONE AROUND A CURVE. AS SGT. MRJENOVICH CAUGHT UP TO THE

VEHICLE, IT WENT THROUGH A RED TRAFFIC SIGNAL WITHOUT STOPPING. A TRAFFIC STOP WAS MADE AND WHILE SPEAKING TO THE DRIVER, A STRONG ODOR OF AN ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGE WAS DETECTED FROM THE DRIVER AS HE SPOKE. THE DRIVER FAILED ALL FIELD SOBRIETY TESTS ATTEMPTED. HE WAS TAKEN INTO CUSTODY. AT THE STATION, THE DRIVER WAS ASKED TO TAKE A BREATH TEST. HE AGREED AND SUBMITTED A BREATH SAMPLE WHICH INDICATED A B.A.C. OF .192. HE WAS CHARGED WITH FOLLOWING TOO CLOSELY, IMPROPER LANE USAGE, SPEEDING, DISOBEYING A TRAFFIC CONTROL SIGNAL, DRIVING UNDER THE INFLUENCE OF ALCOHOL AND HAVING A B.A.C. OVER .08.

OFC. DRAKE OBSERVED A VAN TRAVELING IN THE WRONG LANE TOWARD HIS SQUAD-CAR. HE HAD TO TAKE EVASIVE ACTION TO AVOID BEING STRUCK HEAD ON BY THE VEHICLE. AS HE MADE A U-TURN TO CATCH UP TO THE VEHICLE HE OBSERVED IT TRAVEL THROUGH THE PARKING LOT OF A BUSINESS AND THEN BACK ONTO THE

ROADWAY. OFC. DRAKE INITIATED A TRAFFIC STOP ON THE VEHICLE AND SPOKE WITH THE DRIVER. HE DETECTED A STRONG ODOR OF AN ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGE EMITTING FROM THE DRIVER AS HE SPOKE. THE SUBJECT FAILED ALL FIELD SOBRIETY TESTS ATTEMPTED AND WAS PLACED UNDER ARREST. HE WAS TAKEN TO THE P.D. AND LATER ASKED TO TAKE A BREATH TEST. HE AGREED AND THE TEST INDICATED HE HAD A B.A.C. OF .152. THE SUBJECT WAS CHARGED WITH DRIVING IN THE WRONG LANE, DRIVING UNDER THE INFLUENCE OF ALCOHOL, B.A.C. OVER .08 AND NO INSURANCE.

THE POLICE DEPARTMENT RECEIVED NOTIFICATION FROM THE STATE ATTORNEY'S OFFICE THAT AN ARRESTEE OF OFFICER NOVAK PLED GUILTY TO FELONY AGGRAVATED DRIVING WITH A REVOKED LICENSE AND WAS SENTENCED TO 3 YEARS IN THE ILLINOIS DEPARTMENT OF CORRECTIONS. THE SUBJECT HAD 15 PRIOR CONVICTIONS FOR DRIVING ON A REVOKED LICENSE FOR DUI.

SPEED ENFORCEMENT CONTINUES

SPEED ENFORCEMENT CONTINUED IN JULY WITH OFFICERS WORKING AN ADDITIONAL 60 HOURS CONCENTRATING STRICTLY ON SPEED ENFORCEMENT. DURING THE 60 HOURS OFFICERS ISSUED 145 SPEEDING CITATIONS. FUNDING FOR THE ADDITIONAL SPEED ENFORCEMENT IS FROM A GRANT FROM THE ILLINOIS DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION (I.D.O.T.).

SPEED ENFORCEMENT WILL CONTINUE IN AUGUST. A ROADSIDE SAFETY CHECK AND SEATBELT ENFORCEMENT ZONES WILL ALSO BE CONDUCTED TO COINCIDE WITH THE LABOR DAY HOLIDAY.

ALL OF THESE PROGRAMS ARE AIMED AT SAVING LIVES BY REDUCING IMPAIRED DRIVERS, SPEEDING VEHICLES FROM THE ROADS AND ENSURING DRIVERS ARE PROPERLY RESTRAINED IN VEHICLES.



JULY INVESTIGATION REPORT

THE DETECTIVES HAVE RECEIVED 15 NEW CASES THIS MONTH INVOLVING BURGLARY, DAMAGE TO PROPERTY, DAMAGE TO VEHICLE, BURGLARY FROM VEHICLES, AND THEFTS. THROUGHOUT THE MONTH PREVIOUS CASES HAVE BEEN REVIEWED AND FOLLOWED UP ON IN ATTEMPTS TO LOCATE NEW LEADS.

NEW COMPUTER TECHNOLOGY HAS ALLOWED US TO SEARCH FOR STOLEN ITEMS FROM PREVIOUS BURGLARIES AND THEFTS IN AN ATTEMPT TO LOCATE THE PROPERTY AND IDENTIFY SUSPECTS.

A REPORT WAS FILED FOR A WINDOW BROKEN OUT OF A VEHICLE PARKED IN THE METRA LOT. THERE ARE NO LEADS AT THIS TIME.

A RESIDENT CALLED IN ADVISING THAT THE TIRES ON THEIR VEHICLE WERE SLASHED SOMETIME OVER NIGHT. NO OTHER VEHICLE TIRES WERE REPORTED DAMAGED THAT NIGHT. THE COMPLAINANT STATED THAT THEY HAD NOT RECENTLY HAD A PROBLEM WITH ANYONE THAT MAY HAVE DAMAGED THEIR TIRES.

AN APARTMENT BURGLARY WAS REPORTED WERE FORCED ENTRY WAS DISCOVERED BY THE TENANT. A EVIDENCE TECHNICIAN WAS CALLED OUT TO PROCESS THE SCENE. THERE ARE NO OTHER LEADS AT THIS TIME.

A VEHICLE WAS REPORTED STOLEN OUT OF THE METRA LOT. NO BROKEN GLASS WAS OBSERVED AT THE SCENE. THE VEHICLE WAS ENTERED INTO THE SYSTEM AS STOLEN. WE RECEIVED INFORMATION LATER ON THAT THE VEHICLE HAD BEEN TOWED OUT OF A PARKING LOT IN CHICAGO FOR FAILURE TO PAY FOR PARKING. DAMAGE TO THE VEHICLE WAS OBSERVED AT THE TIME OF RECOVERY. THE OWNER WAS NOTIFIED. THE MATTER WILL BE FOLLOWED UP ON.

A BURGLARY WAS REPORTED TO THE DEPART-

MENT. ENTRY WAS GAINED THROUGH AN OPEN WINDOW TO THE RESIDENCE. AFTER INVESTIGATING THE CASE WE WERE ABLE TO LOCATE A SUSPECT. DUE TO A RELATIONSHIP OF THE OFFENDER AND THE VICTIM NO CHARGES HAVE BEEN FILED AT THIS TIME. THE CASE REMAINS OPEN.

TWO REPORTS WERE RECEIVED THIS MONTH FOR THEFTS OF WHEEL CENTER CAPS ON VEHICLES PARKED IN THE METRA LOT. MANY NEIGHBORING COMMUNITIES HAVE BEEN EXPERIENCING THE SAME TYPES OF THEFTS. COMMONLY TARGETED VEHICLES HAVE BEEN LINCOLNS AND CADILLACS. WE ARE WORKING WITH OTHER AGENCIES TO DEVELOP LEADS ON THESE THEFTS.

WE RECEIVED A REPORT OF A STOLEN MOTOR VEHICLE FROM A RESIDENCE. THE COMPLAINANT ADVISED THAT A FAMILY MEMBER TOOK THE VEHICLE WITHOUT PERMISSION. THE VEHICLE WAS ENTERED INTO THE SYSTEM AS STOLEN. THE VEHICLE WAS LATER RECOVERED ABANDONED IN ANOTHER TOWN. THE OWNER WAS NOTIFIED.

TWO VEHICLES WERE REPORTED TO HAVE BEEN DAMAGED BY SPRAY PAINT WHILE PARKED IN THE METRA LOT. THE VEHICLES APPEARED TO HAVE BEEN RANDOMLY CHOSEN AND NO OTHER VEHICLES WERE REPORTED TO HAVE SIMILAR DAMAGE. THERE ARE NO LEADS AT THIS TIME.

AN ACCIDENT WAS REPORTED IN THE PARKING LOT OF THE SUPER 8 MOTEL. UPON ARRIVAL OFFICERS FOUND A ABANDONED VEHICLE THAT HAD BEEN DRIVEN OFF THE ROADWAY AND INTO A PARKED VEHICLE AT THE HOTEL. THE OWNER OF THE VEHICLE WAS LOCATED AND ADVISED THAT SHE HAD GIVEN THE VEHICLE TO A FRIEND TO USE. THE DRIVER OF THE VEHICLE HAS NOT YET BEEN LOCATED BUT ATTEMPTS ARE BEING MADE.

INVESTIGATION REMAINS OPEN.

A FORCED ENTRY BURGLARY TO AN APARTMENT WAS REPORTED. AN EVIDENCE TECHNICIAN WAS NOTIFIED AND PROCESSED THE SCENE. LEADS WILL BE FOLLOWED UP ON IN THIS MATTER.

A REPORT OF A BROKEN WINDOW TO A VACANT HOUSE WAS REPORTED. A SMALL ROCK MAY HAVE POSSIBLY BROKEN THE UPSTAIRS WINDOW TO THE HOUSE. NO ENTRY WAS MADE TO THE HOUSE. THERE ARE NO LEADS AT THIS TIME.

A REPORT OF CRIMINAL DAMAGE TO A VEHICLE WAS MADE. COMPLAINANT STATED THAT THE WINDOW OF THEIR VEHICLE WAS BROKEN OUT AND CHANGE FROM INSIDE THE VEHICLE WAS TAKEN. NO LEADS AT THIS TIME.

A REPORT WAS FILED FOR AN ATTEMPT STOLEN MOTOR VEHICLE. OFFICERS OBSERVED DAMAGE TO THE IGNITION LOCK OF THE VEHICLE. THE COMPLAINANT ADVISED THAT THEY HAD LEFT THE VEHICLE UNLOCKED THAT DAY.

JULY ADMINISTRATIVE REPORT

ON JULY 8 & 9 WE HOSTED A MOBILE CRASH REPORTING TRAINING PROGRAM FOR ALL OUR OFFICERS. ACCIDENT REPORTS WILL BE COMPLETED ON THE COMPUTERS IN OUR VEHICLES, ELECTRONICALLY APPROVED BY THE SUPERVISORS AND SUBMITTED TO ILLINOIS DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION. WE ALSO RECEIVED A \$2,933.00 GRANT FROM IDOT TO PUT PRINTERS IN ALL FIVE OF OUR VEHICLES.

CONSTRUCTION ON OUR AUTOMATED RED LIGHT ENFORCEMENT CAMERA STARTED ON JULY 13. CONSTRUCTION WAS ESTIMATED AT ABOUT TWO-WEEKS. THE SYSTEM SHOULD BECOME OPERATIONAL IN EARLY AUGUST. THERE IS A 15-DAY PERIOD IN WHICH WARNING NOTICES WILL BE SENT OUT. AFTER THE 15 DAYS VIOLATION NOTICES WILL BE SENT TO ANYONE WHO FAILS TO STOP AT A RED LIGHT. PUBLIC AWARENESS MATERIALS WERE RECEIVED. INFORMATION IS AVAILABLE ON THE VILLAGE'S WEB SITE.

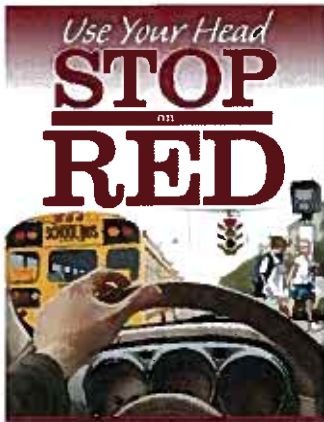

AUTOMATED RED LIGHT ENFORCEMENT TO BEGIN IN AUGUST

IN AN EFFORT TO ENHANCE SAFETY AT ONE OF EAST HAZEL CREST'S MOST DANGEROUS INTERSECTIONS, THE VILLAGE BOARD HAS APPROVED THE INSTALLATION OF AN AUTOMATED TRAFFIC ENFORCEMENT SYSTEM, ALSO KNOWN AS RED LIGHT CAMERAS. THE CAMERA WILL BE OPERATIONAL AT THE INTERSECTION OF 171ST AND HALSTED IN AUGUST 2009.

ACCORDING TO RECENT STUDIES CONDUCTED BY THE U.S. DEPT. OF TRANSPORTATION, RED LIGHT CAMERA PROGRAMS CAN DECREASE RED LIGHT VIOLATIONS UP TO 60%. TRAFFIC ACCIDENTS CAUSED BY RED LIGHT RUNNERS ARE AMONG THE MOST SERIOUS, OFTEN RESULTING IN SEVERE INJURIES AND FATALITIES. STUDIES HAVE SHOWN THAT APPROXIMATELY 1,000 PEOPLE DIE AND 176,000 PEOPLE ARE INJURED ANNUALLY IN THE UNITED STATES BECAUSE OF DRIVERS RUNNING RED LIGHTS.

THERE ARE TWO TYPES OF RED LIGHT VIOLATIONS:

- (1) RIGHT TURN ON RED WITHOUT COMING TO A COMPLETE STOP AND
- (2) ENTERING AN INTERSECTION AFTER THE TRAFFIC SIGNAL HAS TURNED RED.

A COMMON MISCONCEPTION IS THAT THE CAMERAS WILL BE PHOTOGRAPHING EVERYONE AS THEY DRIVE THRU THE COMMUNITY. IN FACT, SENSORS PLACED IN THE PAVEMENT ACTIVATE THE CAMERA ONLY WHEN A VEHICLE ENTERS THE INTERSECTION DURING THE RED LIGHT CYCLE. A TOTAL OF 3 PHOTOGRAPHS WILL BE TAKEN PLUS 8-10 SECONDS OF DIGITAL VIDEO. THE IMAGES INCLUDE: THE CAR ENTERING THE RED LIGHT INTERSECTION, THE CAR PASSING THRU THE INTERSECTION AND FINALLY, A CLOSE-UP OF THE LICENSE PLATE. ALL 3 IMAGES, PLUS A LINK TO VIEW THE VIDEO FOOTAGE ON-LINE, WILL BE PROVIDED TO THE VEHICLE'S REGISTERED OWNER WHO IS MAILED THE VIOLATION. ACCORDING TO ILLINOIS LAW, IT IS ILLEGAL TO PHOTOGRAPH THE FACES OF EITHER DRIVERS OR PASSENGERS.
