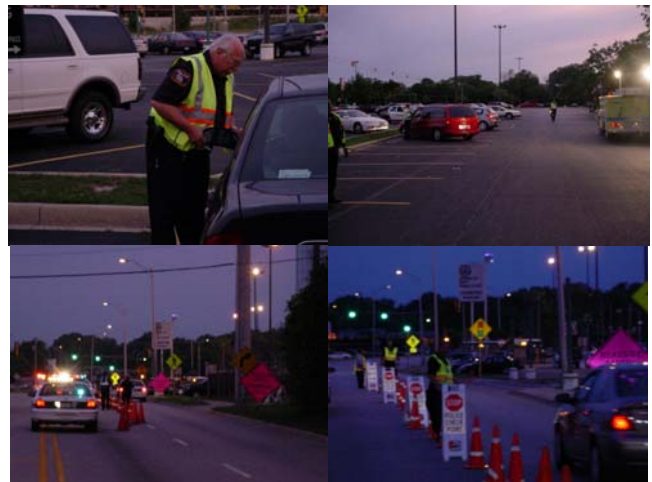
PATROL ACTIVITY

PATROL OFFICERS ANSWERED 446 CALLS FOR SERVICE AND GENERATED 72 REPORTS. THIS INCLUDES THE OFFICERS' SELF INITIATED ACTIVITIES.

TRUCK ENFORCEMENT THIS MONTH GENERATED POTENTIAL FINES OF \$5264.00.

OFFICERS MADE 144 TRAFFIC STOPS THIS MONTH. OFFICERS INVESTIGATED 36 SUSPICIOUS PERSONS OR VEHICLES. MOST OF THESE ARE SELF INITIATED ACTIVITY TO CHECK SUSPICIOUS SITUATIONS IN OUR RESIDENTIAL NEIGHBORHOODS PRIOR TO OFFICERS BEING CALLED. OFFICERS HANDLED 15 TRAFFIC CRASHES AND 18 DOMESTIC PROBLEMS.

OFFICERS MADE 62 ARRESTS IN JUNE INCLUDING 5 FOR D.U.I. (INCLUDING ONE FOR FELONY AGGRAVATED D.U.I. AND FELONY AGGRAVATED DRIVING WITH REVOKED LICENSE FOR HAVING BEEN CONVICTED 15 TIMES FOR DRIVING WITH A LICENSE REVOKED FOR D.U.I. DURING THE ROADSIDE SAFETY CHECK), 3 FOR UNLAWFUL USE OF WEAPONS, 2 FOR FELONY POSSESSION OF COCAINE, 7 FOR POSSESSION OF CANNABIS, 3 FOR POSSESSION OF DRUG PARAPHERNALIA, 16 FOR SUSPENDED, REVOKED OR UNLICENSED DRIVERS. OFFICERS SERVED 5 WARRANTS DURING JUNE.



OFFICERS CONDUCT A ROADSIDE SAFETY CHECK AT 174TH AND WOOD STREET ON JUNE 27. (SEEPAGE 4 FOR MORE INFORMATION)

SGT. WASEK MADE A TRAFFIC STOP ON A VEHICLE FOR MULTIPLE SIGNAL VIOLATIONS. UPON APPROACHING THE VEHICLE, HE OBSERVED A REVOLVER ON THE FLOOR AND ALL THREE OCCUPANTS WERE TAKEN INTO CUSTODY. UPON SEARCHING THE ARRESTEES, CANNABIS WAS RECOVERED FROM TWO OF THE VEHICLES OCCUPANTS. THE DRIVER WAS CHARGED WITH TRAFFIC OFFENSES, HAVING A SUSPENDED LICENSE AND UNLAWFUL USE OF A WEAPON (U.U.W.) FOR POSSESSION OF THE REVOLVER. THE OTHER TWO OCCUPANTS WERE CHARGED WITH POSSESSION OF CANNABIS AND U.U.W.

TRAVELING N/B IN THE S/B LANES OF HALSTED ST. UPON SPEAKING WITH THE DRIVER, AN ODOR OF AN ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGE WAS DETECTED. THE SUBJECT ATTEMPTED FIELD SOBRIETY TESTS. THE DRIVER FAILED THE TESTS AND WAS TAKEN INTO CUSTODY FOR D.U.I. A SEARCH WAS CONDUCTED AND 7 BAGGIES OF A ROCK LIKE SUBSTANCE WERE RECOVERED (CRACK COCAINE). THE DRIVER WAS CHARGED WITH TRAFFIC OFFENSES, D. U.I., HAVING A B.A.C. OVER .08, AND FELONY POSSESSION OF A CONTROLLED SUBSTANCE (COCAINE).

SGT. WASEK MADE A TRAFFIC STOP ON A VE-

HICLE WITH SUSPICIOUS REGISTRATION. UPON SPEAKING WITH THE DRIVER IT WAS LEARNED SHE HAD A REVOKED LICENSE AND SHE WAS TAKEN INTO CUSTODY. DURING A SEARCH OF THE VEHICLE, A CIGARETTE PACK WAS LOCATED CONTAINING A GLASS PIPE AND TWO BAGGIES CONTAINING CRACK COCAINE. THE PASSENGER WAS TAKEN INTO CUSTODY FOR INVESTIGATION. THE DRIVER WAS CHARGED WITH THE REGISTRATION VIOLATIONS AND A REVOKED DRIVERS LICENSE. A CONFESSION WAS OBTAINED AND THE PASSENGER WAS CHARGED WITH FELONY POSSESSION OF A CONTROLLED SUBSTANCE (COCAINE) AND POSSESSION OF DRUG PARAPHERNALIA.

ON JUNE 12, CHIEF ROBERTSON ATTENDED A MEETIIING DOWNTOWN AT METRA'S OFFICES. THE MEETING WAS TO DISCUSS METRA'S EMERGENCY OPERATION PROCEDURES.

CHIEF ROBERTSON ATTENDED THE SOUTH

SUBURBAN ASSOCIATION OF CHIEFS OF POLICE EXECUTIVE BOARD MEETING HELD ON JUNE 21 IN CHICAGO HEIGHTS AND THE GENERAL MEMBERSHIP MEETING IN TINLEY PARK ON JUNE 28.

ON JUNE 26, CHIEF ROBERTSON ATTENDED A MEETING OF SOUTH SUBURBAN EMERGENCY RESPONSE TEAM. TOPICS INCLUDED UPDATED OPERATION PROCEDURES.

ON JUNE 27, CHIEF ROBERTSON ATTENDED THE MONTHLY FBI NATIONAL ACADEMY MEETING IN NORTH CHICAGO. TRAINING WAS PROVIDED ON ISLAM AND THE MUSLIM CULTURE.

OFFICER KRIS VALLOW HAS BEEN ASSIGNED TO THE SOUTH SUBURBAN MAJOR CRIMES TASK FORCE. HE IS REPLACING OFFICER DRAKE WHO SERVED IN THAT POSITION FOR MANY YEARS AND WORKED ON MANY HOMICIDE CASES IN THE SOUTH SUBURBS.

JUNE INVESTIGATION REPORT

THE DETECTIVES DIVISION CURRENTLY HAS APPROXIMATELY 32 OPEN INVESTIGATIONS FOR THE YEAR 2007. SOME OF THE INVESTIGATIONS BEING HANDLED INCLUDE BURGLARY (RESIDENTIAL AND TO MOTOR VEHICLE), THEFT, FINANCIAL IDENTITY THEFT, ARMED ROBBERY AND CRIMINAL DAMAGE TO PROPERTY.

THESE CASES HAVE PUT INVESTIGATORS IN CONTACT WITH INVESTIGATORS AND SUSPECTS FROM HAZEL CREST, SOUTH HOLLAND, RIVERDALE AND HOMEWOOD IN AN ATTEMPT TO GAIN INFORMATION, INCREASE NETWORKING CAPABILITIES AND TO CONDUCT FOLLOW UP INTERVIEWS, INVESTIGATIONS AND ARRESTS.

INVESTIGATORS ARE LOOKING INTO 6 ATTEMPT BURGLARIES TO MOTOR VEHICLES THAT ALL OCCURRED ON THE SAME DAY IN THE CALUMET METRA TRAIN STATION'S EAST PARKING LOT. ALL THE VEHICLES WERE DAMAGED IN SOME WAY, WITH MOST OF THE DAMAGE BEING CAUSED TO THE VEHICLE'S OUTER DOOR HANDLES. THE VEHICLES WERE RANSACKED BUT NOTHING HAS BEEN REPORTED AS BEING STOLEN. LATENT FINGER AND PALM PRINTS FROM THE POSSIBLE OFFENDER(S) WERE RECOVERED FROM THE SCENE AND SENT TO ISP STATE CRIME LAB FOR ANALYSIS. INVESTIGATION ON-GOING.

A RESIDENTIAL BURGLARY OCCURRED TO 1825 W 171ST STREET 2ND FLOOR APARTMENT. THE OFFENDERS GAINED ENTRY BY BREAKING OUT THE APARTMENT'S REAR DOOR WINDOW. TAKEN FROM THE RESIDENCE WERE JEWELRY, CLOTHING, FOOD, A LUNCH BAG, A DIGITAL CAMERA AND AN MP3 PLAYER. SEVERAL NEIGHBORS WITNESSED THE OFFENDERS AS THEY WERE LEAVING FROM THE VICTIM'S RESIDENCE, WITH ONE NEIGHBOR EVEN CHASING AFTER THE SUBJECTS BUT HE WAS UNABLE TO APPREHEND THEM. THROUGH A PHOTO LINEUP ONE OFFENDER WAS IDENTIFIED. LATER THAT WEEK AN INVESTIGATOR, WHILE WORKING WITH THE NETWORK 3

TACT UNIT, WAS ASSISTING HAZEL CREST PD WITH A STOLEN AUTO THAT FLED FROM A TRAFFIC STOP. THE OFFENDERS FROM THE STOLEN AUTO RAN INTO A RESIDENCE IN HAZEL CREST. THE HOUSE WAS SURROUNDED AND THE OFFENDERS WERE APPREHENDED. TWO SUBJECTS WERE COINCIDENTALLY THE SAME SUSPECTS FOR THE EHC RESIDENTIAL BURGLARY. WHILE SPEAKING WITH THE TENANT AT THE HAZEL CREST RESIDENCE THE INVESTIGATOR WAS ABLE TO GAIN VITAL INFORMATION AND EVEN LOCATED SOME OF THE STOLEN PROCEEDS FOR THE RESIDENTIAL BURGLARY. THE NEXT DAY ONE OFFENDER WAS ARRESTED IN HAZEL CREST BY AN INVESTIGATOR. THE OFFENDER SUPPLIED A WRITTEN STATEMENT GIVING HIS INVOLVEMENT IN THE RESIDENTIAL BURGLARY. HE WAS CHARGED FOR THIS OFFENSE. THE ACCOMPLICE WAS RELEASED FROM HCPD PRIOR TO BEING ARRESTED BY EHC. WE ARE CURRENTLY SEEKING THIS SUBJECT FOR FOLLOW-UP INVESTIGATION/CHARGING.

A SEPARATE RESIDENTIAL BURGLARY OCCURRED AT 17305 WOODED PATH DR. THE OFFENDERS FORCED ENTRY THROUGH THE FRONT SECURITY DOOR AND STOLE SEVERAL ITEMS, INCLUDING A WEDDING RING, PLAYSTATION 2 PLUS SEVERAL GAMES FOR THAT ENTERTAINMENT SYSTEM, FOOD AND 2 PURSES. LATENT FINGER AND PALM PRINTS OF THE POSSIBLE OFFENDERS WERE RECOVERED FROM THE SCENE AND SENT TO THE ISP STATE CRIME LAB FOR ANALYSIS. INVESTIGATION ON-GOING.

INVESTIGATORS ARE LOOKING INTO A THEFT FROM AND CRIMINAL DAMAGE TO A MOTOR VEHICLE AFTER THE CATALYTIC CONVERTER FROM THE VICTIM'S VEHICLE WAS CUT OFF. IMAGES OF THE POSSIBLE OFFENDERS VEHICLE WERE CAPTURED ON THE NEWLY INSTALLED CAMERA IN THE MAIN PARKING LOT. THOSE IMAGES WERE TURNED OVER TO AN ASSISTING AGENCY IN AN ATTEMPT TO ENHANCE THE IMAGES SO AN OFFENDER MAY BE IDENTIFIED.

JUNE ROADSIDE SAFETY CHECK

ON JUNE 29, 2007 THE EAST HAZEL CREST POLICE DEPARTMENT CONDUCTED A ROADSIDE SAFETY CHECK POINT FROM THE HOURS OF 8:00PM UNTIL 2:00AM AT 174TH AND WOOD ST.

THE PRIMARY GOAL OF A ROADSIDE SAFETY CHECK IS TO SAVE LIVES AND REDUCE INJURIES BY DISCOURAGING VIOLATIONS OF DRIVING UNDER THE INFLUENCE AND SEATBELT LAWS.

DURING THIS SIX-HOUR PERIOD, 830 VEHICLES TRAVELED THROUGH THE CHECKPOINT WITH 226 VEHICLES BEING CHECKED FOR THE DRIVERS BEING IMPAIRED, UNLICENSED, UNBELTED, UNINSURED, THE PASSENGERS BEING PROPERLY RESTRAINED, THE VEHICLES EQUIPMENT FUNCTIONING PROPERLY AND OTHER VIOLATIONS, WHICH THE OFFICERS MAY HAVE DETECTED SUCH AS OPEN ALCOHOL IN THE CAR.

DURING THIS OPERATION, OFFICERS MADE 11 ARRESTS FOR DRIVING WHILE DRIVERS LICENSES WERE SUSPENDED OR REVOKED, POSSESSION OF CANNABIS, POSSESSION OF DRUG PARAPHERNALIA, FUGITIVE WARRANTS AND DUI.

ONE DUI ARREST WAS MADE WERE THE DRIVER WAS INTOXICATED AND HAD PREVIOUSLY HAD HIS LICENSE REVOKED FOR DUI. THE DRIVER HAD BEEN ARRESTED AND CONVICTED 15 PRIOR TIMES FOR DRIVING WHILE HIS LICENSE WAS SUSPENDED BECAUSE OF A DUI ARREST. THIS SUBJECT HAD SPENT TIME IN PRISON FOR PAST DRIVING VIOLATIONS AND WAS CURRENTLY ON PAROLE FOR THE SAME VIOLATION. THE STATES ATTORNEYS OFFICE WAS CONTACTED AND BECAUSE OF HIS PRIOR VIOLATIONS A CLASS 2 FELONY CHARGE WAS APPROVED WHICH IF CONVICTED SHOULD VIOLATE THIS OFFENDERS PAROLE AND SEND HIM BACK TO PRISON WITH ADDITIONAL TIME ADDED TO HIS TERM.

OVERALL THIS DETAIL WAS VERY SUCCESSFUL AND REMOVED DRIVERS FROM THE ROAD WHO DID NOT BELONG ON THE ROAD.

ADDITIONAL PERSONNEL, TRAFFIC CONTROL ASSISTANCE AND ADDITIONAL SAFETY EQUIPMENT (EMERGENCY VEHICLES, TRAFFIC SAFETY DEVICES, SUPPLEMENTAL LIGHTING) WAS PROVIDED THROUGH LYNWOOD, THORNTON AND SOUTH HOLLAND EMERGENCY SERVICES UNIT. FUNDING WAS PROVIDED THROUGH A GRANT FROM THE ILLINOIS DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION.
