SEPTEMBER 2010 POLICE DEPARTMENT ACTIVITY REPORT

PATROL ACTIVITY

OFFICERS ANSWERED 432 CALLS FOR SERVICE INCLUDING THEIR SELF INITIATED ACTIVITY. THERE WERE 8 DOMESTIC PROBLEMS, 3 TRAFFIC CRASHES, 2 THEFTS, 4 BURGLARIES, 4 DISTURBANCES, 14 ALARMS AND 16 SUSPICIOUS PERSON OR VEHICLES. OFFICERS ASSISTED 17 CITIZENS AND MOTORISTS. 221 TRAFFIC STOPS WERE MADE AND A STOLEN VEHICLE WAS RECOVERED. 77 REPORTS WERE GENERATED DURING SEPTEMBER.

OFFICERS MADE 60 ARRESTS INCLUDING DOMESTIC BATTERY, 8 FOR D.U.I. (2 WERE FELONIES), 6 FOR POSSESSION OF CANNABIS, ENDANGERING THE LIFE OF A CHILD, CRIMINAL TRESPASS TO A VEHICLE, 4 FOR UNDERAGE CONSUMPTION OF ALCOHOL, 28 FOR SUSPENDED, REVOKED OR UNLICENSED DRIVERS.

TRUCK ENFORCEMENT GENERATED POTENTIAL FINES OF \$16,754.00.

SGT. WASEK OBSERVED A VEHICLE MAKE A TURN VIOLATING THE RED TRAFFIC SIGNAL. THE VEHICLE THEN TRAVELED STRADDLING THE LANE STRIPING. SGT. WASEK STOPPED THE VEHICLE AND SPOKE WITH THE DRIVER DETECTING AN ODOR OF ALCOHOL COMING FROM THE DRIVER AS HE SPOKE. THE SUBJECT WAS ASKED TO PERFORM FIELD SOBRIETY TESTS AND HE FAILED ALL TESTS ATTEMPTED. HE WAS TAKEN INTO CUSTODY AND TRANSPORTED TO THE P.D. HE REFUSED TO SUBMIT TO A BREATH TEST AND WAS TAKEN TO THE HOSPITAL WHERE HE GAVE A BLOOD SAMPLE FOR TESTING. THE SUBJECT WAS DRIVING ON A SUSPENSION FOR A D.U.I.

WHEN HE WAS STOPPED. HE WAS CHARGED WITH DISOBEYING A RED TRAFFIC SIGNAL, IMPROPER LANE USAGE, DRIVING ON A SUSPENDED LICENSE, AND D.U.I. HE WAS ALSO CHARGED WITH A FELONY FOR AGGRAVATED D.U.I. FOR DRIVING UNDER THE INFLUENCE WHILE HIS LICENSE WAS SUSPENDED. MORE CHARGES ARE PENDING THE RESULTS OF THE BLOOD ANALYSIS.

SGT. WASEK HEARD OVER THE RADIO A REPORT OF A RECKLESS DRIVER ON ASHLAND AVE. HE WAS WORKING A SEATBELT ENFORCEMENT ZONE AND OBSERVED THE VEHICLE APPROACHING. IT WAS DIRECTED INTO THE ZONE AND SGT. WASEK SPOKE WITH THE DRIVER DETECTING AN ODOR OF ALCOHOL COMING FROM THE SUBJECT. HE ALSO OBSERVED A TWO YEAR OLD CHILD NOT IN A CHILD RESTRAINT. THE DRIVER ADMITTED TO DRINKING 5 BEERS. THE SUBJECT WAS ASKED TO PERFORM

FIELD SOBRIETY TESTS AND AGREED. SHE FAILED ALL THE TESTS ATTEMPTED. SHE WAS TAKEN INTO CUSTODY AND TRANSPORTED TO THE P.D. AN OPEN BOTTLE OF MILLER BEER WAS LOCATED IN THE VEHICLE. SHE AGREED TO TAKE A BREATH TEST AND SUBMITTED A BREATH SAMPLE WHICH INDICATED A BLOOD ALCOHOL CONTENT (B.A.C.) OF .210, OVER 2 ½ TIMES THE LEGAL LIMIT. SHE WAS CHARGED WITH NO CHILD RESTRAINT, D.U.I., B.A.C. OVER .08 AND ILLEGAL TRANSPORTATION OF ALCOHOL. THE WITNESS WHO CALLED IN THE RECKLESS DRIVER WAS CONTACTED AND STATED THAT SHE ALMOST STRUCK HIM WITH HER VEHICLE AND WAS DRINKING BEER AS SHE DROVE BY HIM.

OFC. PELOZA OBSERVED A VEHICLE MAKE A LEFT HAND TURN VIOLATING A RED TRAFFIC SIGNAL. OFC. PELOZA STOPPED THE VEHICLE AND SPOKE WITH THE DRIVER REQUESTING HIS LICENSE. THE DRIVER HANDED HIM A FIREARMS I.D. HE DETECTED AN ODOR OF AN ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGE COMING FROM THE DRIVER AS HE SPOKE. THE DRIVER EXITED THE VEHICLE STAGGERING AS HE WALKED. HE AGREED TO TAKE FIELD SOBRIETY TESTS AND FAILED ALL THE TESTS HE ATTEMPTED. HE WAS TAKEN INTO CUSTODY FOR D.U.I. AND TRANSPORTED TO THE P.D. AT THE STATION, HE AGREED TO TAKE A BREATH TEST WHICH INDICATED A B.A.C. OF .202, 2 ½ TIMES THE LEGAL LIMIT. HE WAS CHARGED WITH DISOBEYING A TRAFFIC SIGNAL, D.U.I. AND B.A.C. OVER .08.

SGT. MRJENOVICH OBSERVED AN SUV TRAVELING WITH ITS HEADLIGHTS GOING ON AND OFF. THE SUV TRAVELED OVER THE LANE STRIPING AT LEAST THREE TIMES. THE DRIVER PULLED INTO A RESIDENTIAL DRIVEWAY AND STOPPED. SGT. MRJENOVICH SPOKE WITH THE DRIVER ASKING WHY SHE STOPPED IN THE RESIDENT'S DRIVEWAY. SHE COULD NOT IDENTIFY THE RESIDENT WHO LIVED THERE, LATER ADMITTING TO TRYING TO HIDE FROM THE OFFICER. AN ODOR OF ALCOHOL WAS DETECTED AND THE SUBJECT WAS ASKED TO PERFORM FIELD SOBRIETY TESTS. SHE FAILED ALL

THE TESTS AND WAS TAKEN INTO CUSTODY FOR D.U.I. AT THE STATION, SHE AGREED TO TAKE A BREATH TEST AND SUBMITTED A BREATH SAMPLE INDICATING A B.A.C. OF .124. SHE WAS CHARGED WITH DRIVING WITHOUT LIGHTS, IMPROPER LANE USAGE, D.U.I. AND HAVING A B.A.C. OVER .08.

SGT. WASEK OBSERVED A FEMALE SITTING NEAR A BUSH BY A RESIDENCE VOMITING. THE SUBJECT APPEARED UNDER 21 YEARS OF AGE WHICH WAS LATER CONFIRMED. THE SUBJECT SLURRED HER SPEECH AND HAD A STRONG ODOR OF ALCOHOL COMING FROM HER AS SHE SPOKE. SHE RELATED SHE HAD BEEN DRINKING AT A NEARBY RESIDENCE. THE OWNER OF THE RESIDENCE WAS CONTACTED AND ADMITTED TO KNOWING THE GIRL WAS UNDER 21 YEARS OLD. HE STATED THAT WAS OK BECAUSE IT WAS HIS HOUSE. BOTH THE FEMALE AND THE HOMEOWNER WERE TAKEN INTO CUSTODY. THE FEMALE WAS CHARGED WITH UNDERAGE CONSUMPTION OF ALCOHOL AND RELEASED TO A PARENT. THE HOMEOWNER WAS CHARGED WITH UNLAWFULLY PERMITTING A MINOR TO BECOME INTOXICATED.

OFC. DRAKE HEARD A CALL FOR HOMEWOOD OFFICERS OF A NAKED FEMALE RUNNING FROM THE TARGET STORE. HE ARRIVED AND LOCATED THE WOMAN WHO STATED SHE FLED AN EAST HAZEL CREST MOTEL WHERE SHE HAD BEEN BATTERED BY HER BOYFRIEND. SHE SAID THE BOYFRIEND HAD PUSHED HER INTO A WALL, TAKEN HER MONEY AND THEN FLED, SO SHE FOLLOWED HIM TO GET HER MONEY BACK. A CHECK ON THE MALE INDICATED HE HAD AN ACTIVE WARRANT OUT OF THE DEPARTMENT OF CORRECTIONS. HE WAS TAKEN INTO CUSTODY, CHARGED WITH DOMESTIC BATTERY AND THE WARRANT WAS SERVED.

OFC. NOVAK OBSERVED A VAN TRAVELING ON THE WRONG SIDE OF THE ROADWAY. IT THEN MADE A TURN WITHOUT SIGNALING AND DISOBEYED A STOP SIGN. OFC. NOVAK INITIATED A TRAFFIC STOP. HE SPOKE WITH THE DRIVER DETECTING A STRONG ODOR OF ALCOHOL FROM

THE DRIVERS BREATH AS HE SPOKE. THE SUBJECT ATTEMPTED AND FAILED FIELD SOBRIETY TESTS. HE WAS TAKEN INTO CUSTODY AND TRANSPORTED TO THE STATION. AT THE P.D., HE AGREED TO TAKE A BREATH TEST AND SUBMITTED A BREATH SAMPLE WHICH INDICATED A B.A.C. OF .146, OVER 1 ½ TIMES THE LEGAL LIMIT. HE WAS CHARGED WITH DRIVING IN THE WRONG LANE, DISOBEYING A STOP SIGN, FAILURE TO SIGNAL, D.U.I. AND B.A.C. OVER .08.

OFC. NOVAK OBSERVED AN SUV MAKE A LEFT HAND TURN FROM THE FAR RIGHT HAND LANE. THE VEHICLE ALSO HAD MULTIPLE TELEVISIONS OPERATING IN THE DRIVERS COMPARTMENT. A TRAFFIC STOP WAS MADE AND OFC. NOVAK SPOKE WITH THE DRIVER. HE DETECTED A STRONG ODOR OF ALCOHOL COMING FROM THE DRIVER AS HE SPOKE. THE DRIVER WAS ASKED TO PERFORM FIELD SOBRIETY TESTS AND AGREED. HE FAILED ALL TESTS ATTEMPTED. HE WAS ARRESTED FOR D.U.I. AND TRANSPORTED TO THE STATION. THE SUBJECT LATER REFUSED ALL CHEMICAL TESTS. HE WAS CHARGED WITH EQUIPMENT VIOLATIONS, IMPROPER TURN AND D.U.I.

WHILE WORKING THE NETWORK 3 TACT UNIT, OFC. GIANNINI OBSERVED A SUSPICIOUS OCCUPIED VEHICLE SITTING IN THE REAR OF A LOCAL MOTEL. AS THE OFFICERS APPROACHED THEY OBSERVED THE DRIVER TRY TO HIDE SOMETHING BEHIND HIS SEAT. WHEN THEY SPOKE WITH THE DRIVER, A STRONG ODOR OF UNBURNED CANNABIS WAS DETECTED COMING FROM INSIDE THE VEHICLE. DURING A SEARCH OF THE VEHICLE, OFFICERS LOCATED 21 INDIVIDUAL BAGS OF PLANT MATERIAL. THE PLANT MATERIAL WEIGHED OVER 19 GRAMS AND TESTED POSITIVE FOR CANNABIS. THE DRIVER ADMITTED THAT THE CANNABIS WAS HIS AND THE OTHERS WERE RELEASED. THE SUBJECT WAS CHARGED WITH POSSESSION OF CANNABIS.

SGT. MRJENOVICH OBSERVED A VEHICLE DRIVE OVER THE CONCRETE MEDIAN ON THE I-80 OVER-

PASS TO MAKE A U-TURN AND THEN DRIVE ON THE OPPOSITE SHOULDER BEFORE PULLING IN FRONT OF AN ONCOMING VEHICLE. THE APPROACHING VEHICLE HAD TO TAKE EVASIVE ACTION TO AVOID A COLLISION. THE VEHICLE THEN MADE A RIGHT HAND TURN FROM THE WRONG LANE. SGT. MRJENOVICH CAUGHT UP TO THE VEHICLE AS IT TRAVELED ON THE WRONG SIDE OF THE ROADWAY AND MADE A TRAFFIC STOP. UPON SPEAKING WITH THE DRIVER, A STRONG ODOR OF AN ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGE WAS DETECTED. THE DRIVER WAS ASKED TO PERFORM FIELD SOBRIETY TESTS AND FAILED ALL THE TESTS ATTEMPTED. HE WAS TAKEN INTO CUSTODY AND TRANSPORTED TO THE STATION. IT WAS LEARNED THAT HE HAD NEVER BEEN ISSUED A DRIVERS LICENSE. HE REFUSED TO COMPLY WITH ANY CHEMICAL TESTS. THE SUBJECT WAS CHARGED WITH IMPROPER U-TURN, DRIVING ON THE SHOULDER, VIOLATING A MEDIAN, IMPROPER TURN, NO VALID LICENSE AND D.U.I. THE SUBJECT WAS ALSO CHARGED WITH FELONY AGGRAVATED DRIVING UNDER THE INFLUENCE OF ALCOHOL FOR DRIVING IMPAIRED WITHOUT A LICENSE.

SGT. WASEK AND OFC. PELOZA CONDUCTED A PREMISE CHECK AT A LOCAL MOTEL WITH THE ASSISTANCE OF THORNTON K-9 OFC. HOUTS AND HIS PARTNER ADO. THE K-9 ALERTED TO THE PRESENCE OF NARCOTICS AT A ROOM AND OFFICERS KNOCKED ON THE DOOR. THE FEMALE WHO RENTED THE ROOM ANSWERED AND GAVE OFFICERS PERMISSION TO SEARCH THE ROOM. DURING THE SEARCH, OFFICERS LOCATED 5 SMALL BAGS OF PLANT MATERIAL THAT TESTED POSITIVE FOR CANNABIS. A CHECK WAS CONDUCTED ON BOTH OCCUPANTS OF THE ROOM AND THE MALE SUBJECT HAD AN ACTIVE WARRANT FROM THE ILLINOIS DEPARTMENT OF CORRECTIONS FOR A PAROLE VIOLATION. HE WAS TAKEN INTO CUSTODY AND LATER ADMITTED THAT THE CANNABIS WAS HIS. SEVERAL ITEMS

WERE LOCATED IN THE ROOM INCLUDING NUMEROUS WATCHES, COLLECTABLE COMIC BOOKS, GAME SYSTEMS, A COMPUTER AND \$9,000.00 IN CASH. THE ITEMS WERE SEIZED TO DETERMINE OWNERSHIP AS THE OCCUPANTS COULD NOT GIVE DETAILS AS TO WHO OWNED THE ITEMS. OFFICERS PUT A FLYER OUT TO AREA POLICE DEPARTMENTS LISTING THE RECOVERED ITEMS. THE DEPARTMENT WAS CONTACTED BY STEGER P.D. DETECTIVES WHO STATED THE ITEMS WERE TAKEN IN A BURGLARY IN STEGER ONLY A FEW HOURS PRIOR TO THEIR RECOVERY. THE VICTIM POSITIVELY IDENTIFIED THE ITEMS AND THEY WERE TURNED OVER TO STEGER P.D. FOR PROSECUTION ON THE BURGLARY. SHORTLY AFTER THE

PROPERTY WAS IDENTIFIED THE OFFENDERS GIRLFRIEND CALLED THE POLICE DEPARTMENT LOOKING FOR SOME OF HER PROPERTY. SHE CAME INTO THE POLICE DEPARTMENT AND WAS DETAINED FOR THE STEGER DETECTIVE. SHE WAS ABLE TO ASSIST STEGER IN RECOVERING ADDITIONAL PROPERTY. THE MALE WAS CHARGED WITH POSSESSION OF CANNABIS AND THE PAROLE VIOLATION WARRANT WAS SERVED. HE WAS THEN PICKED UP AND CHARGED BY CHICAGO POLICE WITH FIVE BURGLARIES. STEGER P.D. IS LOOKING AT HIM AS A SUSPECT IN UP TO 10 ADDITIONAL BURGLARIES.

INVESTIGATORS RECEIVED A MISSING PERSON REPORT OF A 17 YEAR OLD. THE MISSING PERSON HAS BEEN IN TOUCH WITH THEIR GUARDIAN VIA PHONE. INVESTIGATORS WERE GIVEN SEVERAL PHONE NUMBERS THAT THE MISSING PERSON CALLED FROM. ALL OF THE ADDRESSES AND AREAS WERE CHECKED FOR THE MISSING PERSON WITH NEGATIVE RESULTS. CASE STILL OPEN.

THERE WAS A MOTORCYCLE STOLEN FROM THE PUBLIC STORAGE THIS MONTH. INVESTIGATORS

HAVE FOLLOWED UP ON NUMEROUS LEADS AND ARE ACTIVELY PURSUING CHARGES IN THIS MATTER.

THERE WAS A BURGLARY TO A VACANT RESIDENCE REPORTED IN THE 1800 BLOCK OF 171ST. OFFENDER(S) ENTERED A VACANT PREMISE AND REMOVED COPPER PIPING FROM THE BUILDING. LEADS ARE BEING FOLLOWED UP ON.

THERE WAS A GARAGE BURGLARY REPORTED THIS MONTH IN THE 1900BLK OF 171ST. RIMS AND STEREO EQUIPMENT WERE TAKEN. THIS RESIDENT ALSO REPORTED A BREAK IN EARLIER THIS MONTH AS WELL WHERE UNAUTHORIZED PERSON(S) GAINED ENTRY TO THE RESIDENCE BUT DID NOT REMOVE ANY KNOWN PROPERTY.

ON SEPTEMBER 15 CHIEF ROBERTSON ATTENDED A MANDATORY MEETING FOR ALL ILLINOIS DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION-DIVISION OF TRAFFIC SAFETY GRANT RECIPIENTS IN JOLIET.

CHIEF ROBERTSON ATTENDED THE SOUTH SUBURBAN CHIEFS EXECUTIVE BOARD MEETING ON SEPTEMBER 16 AND THE GENERAL MEMBERSHIP MEETING ON SEPTEMBER 23.

ON SEPTEMBER 16 & 17 WE HOSTED A TASER INSTRUCTOR CLASS. OFFICER TULEY ATTENDED THE 2-DAY CLASS, WHILE OFFICER NOVAK ATTENDED THE SECOND DAY

FOR RECERTIFICATION. ENROLLMENT FOR EACH OFFICER WAS ONLY \$25.00 RATHER THAN THE REGULAR \$350 FOR NEW CERTIFICATIONS AND \$175 FOR RECERTIFICATION BECAUSE WE HOSTED THE CLASS.

OFFICER NOVAK ATTENDED THE SOUTH SUBURBAN EMERGENCY RESPONSE TRAINING AT THE U.S. TRAINING CENTER IN MOUNT CARROLL ILLINOIS ON SEPTEMBER 26-28.

OFFICER NOVAK HAD ALSO RESPONDED TO A SSERT CALLOUT ON SEPTEMBER 18 FOR A BARRICADED GUNMAN IN CHICAGO HEIGHTS. THE OFFENDER HAD A 6-YEAR OLD BOY IN THE RESIDENCE WITH HIM AT THE TIME OF THE STANDOFF.

WE FILED NEW ASSET FORFEITURE CASES IN THE AMOUNT OF \$57,350.00.

STAFF MET WITH THE ARCHITECT ON SEPTEMBER TO DISCUSS PLANS TO ADD ONTO THE POLICE DEPARTMENT USING FEDERAL ASSET FORFEITURE FUNDS TO PAY FOR THE ADDITION.

DURING THE MONTH OF SEPTEMBER EMPLOYEES USED 12 DAYS OF VACATION TIME, 4 DAYS PERSONAL TIME, 1 DAY HOLIDAY TIME AND 7 DAYS OF SICK TIME.

TRAFFIC SAFETY

OFFICERS CONDUCTED ADDITIONAL ENFORCEMENT PATROLS TARGETING INTOXICATED DRIVERS DURING SEPTEMBER. EIGHT DRIVERS WERE ARRESTED FOR D.U.I. INCLUDING TWO FOR FELONY AGGRAVATED DRIVING UNDER THE INFLUENCE OF ALCOHOL. SEATBELT ENFORCEMENT ZONES WERE CONDUCTED DURING SEPTEMBER WHICH LED TO SEVERAL ARRESTS, INCLUDING POSSESSION OF CANNABIS AND A D.U.I. OFFICERS ALSO CONDUCTED SPECIAL PEDESTRIAN CROSSING DETAILS AFTER WARNING PEDESTRIANS FOR SEVERAL WEEKS PRIOR TO ISSUING CITATIONS. OFFICERS STILL ISSUED NUMEROUS CITATIONS EVEN AFTER THE PEDESTRIANS RECEIVED WARNINGS FOR THE VIOLATIONS.
